NMCDC Receives Funding to Renovate Parking Lots

NMCDC applied for additional funding at the beginning of their grant year to renovate the Lincoln Center and HRDC Center parking lots.

The new parking lots will provide a safe experience for the children, while also allowing for educational opportunities. Sidewalks and painted crosswalks will provide students with the chance to better understand pedestrian safety.

The renovation also includes the installation of two lamp posts in the HRDC center parking lot. The added lighting will make the parking lot much safer at night. The project was completed on August 29th, 2020.

CARES Act Rental Assistance Available

Through funding made available by the CARES Act, the Housing Program is able to provide rental assistance to households affected by COVID-19 in Hill, Blaine, Liberty, Phillips, Valley, Daniels, Sheridan, and Roosevelt counties. Twenty families have received rental assistance so far.

Employment and Training Program Seeking Applicants for WIOA Youth Program

The Employment and Training Program is accepting applications for the WIOA (Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act) Youth Program for individuals ages 16 to 24. Eligible individuals must meet one of the following criteria: dropped out of high school, graduated but not enrolled in college, or graduated and unemployed.

The WIOA program provides services such as: job search assistance, work experience, career exploration, resume building, interview preparation, Hi-Set training, Driver License preparation, and more.

With a combination of distance learning, social distancing, and sanitation, the Adult Education Program has assisted 30 individuals so far in 2020 in earning their HiSET (High School Equivalency Diploma) formerly known as the GED. HRDC applauds these individuals' dedication and resolve. Overcoming adversity is truly a sign of character.

HiSET testing resumed in May and has continued throughout the summer. In addition to HiSET testing, the Adult Education program provides many other services to assist people in the community and supplement other programs within the tri-county area served.

Energy Program Gears up for LIEAP Season

On October 1st the Energy Program will begin taking applications for the regular LIEAP (Low Income Energy Assistance) season. Please remember that applications will be processed in the order that a complete application is received.
