A free meal was also provided at the event. Northern Montana Child Development Center had applications for Head Start and Early Head Start available so families could apply during the event.

Many community partners also provided activities at the Family Fun Day including: Family Connections, Bullhook Community Clinic, Plant-a-Seed Read, Havre-Hill County Library, Hill County Health Department, and Waterford Upstart

Approximately 300 people attended the Family Fun Day. Northern Montana Child Development Center received 8 applications and scheduled 4 intakes during the event. NMCDC is hoping to hold this event again next year.













Head Start Summer Cohort Visits Wahkpa Chu'gn Buffalo Jump

Northern Montana Child Development
Center is in the midst of their final Head
Start summer cohort, thanks to COVID-19
related funding. This summer they are
serving 14 Head Start children, most of who
are transitioning into kindergarten this fall,
and some who have an Individualized
Education Plan (IEP) and need some extra
help to prepare for their upcoming school
year.

In July the children and a handful of adults visited the Wahkpa Chu'gn Buffalo Jump, thanks to the Johnson O'Malley grant from Stone Child College. This provided the children a new type of educational opportunity to better understand Native American history. The children and adults had a great time and NMCDC is planning to provide this opportunity to all of their Head Start students.

A Few Changes Made to the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program for the 2022-23 Season

The program formerly known as LIEAP is now the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP). Income verification will now only need to be provided for the month prior to applying for assistance. For example, if someone is submitting an application in October 2022 then the only income needed is September 2022.

The Energy Program completed its first year of the Low Income Home Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP) and it will continue to be offered through the 2022-2023 season. In order to receive assistance through LIHWAP, applicants must complete the water assistance portion of the LIHEAP Application. If anyone needs assistance with this portion of the application, call the Energy Program at 406-265-6743. The Energy Program staff may have some suggestions to assist applicants with qualifying for this assistance.

Havre Community Food Bank in Need of Donations

The Havre Community Food Bank has seen a drastic increase in use recently. With the increase in demand the Food Bank has had to reduce the amount of food given to families to ensure that they can help all who are eligible in the community. Increased usage has also caused the Food Bank to require more paid work time for employees which is putting a strain on an already small budget.

The Food Bank is in need of donations of shelf-stable goods, other food items, money, and volunteer time.
